Honorable City Council: Re: Request for the Transfer Emergency Funds for Contractual Services to Provide Floodwater Controls along the Fox Creek Canal.

As a result of constant seepage through the berm caused by missing sections of the concrete seawall, and an increase in water pressure against the berm bordering the east side of the Fox Creek Canal, the safety and protection of this structure has been compromised. In addition, the Army Corps of Engineers has projected an increase in water levels during the Month of July. The City Engineer has determined that immediate action is needed to erect and construct a new structure along Fox Creek to control flood waters in certain areas within the City of Detroit to ensure the public safety, health, and welfare.

In order to expedite the time schedule to permit immediate construction activity to control and abate present and anticipated high water levels, it is necessary to utilize the emergency provision of the City of Detroit Code, Section 21-3-6(B) which provides for waiver of competitive bids when "Public exigencies require the immediate delivery of the articles or per-formance of the service." Therefore, the Department of Public Works respectfully requests to enter into contract with O'Laughlin Construction Company to provide sheet piling and clay dikes in the subject area. The work will commence within 24 hours of issuance of the Notice to Proceed.

The construction cost for this project is \$2.5 Million Dollars. The total amount of sheet piling work is 6,500 linear feet, of which only 5,000 linear feet abuts the street right-of-way. Therefore, only \$1,925,000 is eligible for street funds. It is requested that your Honorable Body approve the transfer of the sum of Five Hundred Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$575,000) from available funds, as outlined in the attached Resolution. The remaining balance of \$1,925,000 will be paid from Appropriation No. 4189, Major Street Fund Capital.

As an additional measure to protect and safeguard the riparian owners in the vicinity, the department is in discussions with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to provide financial, technical, and advance measures assistance in the affected areas.

Your continued cooperation is appreciated.
