The report and awards of the jury in said matter were confirmed by said Court on the fifth day of September, A. D. 1865. Subsequently Theodore Romeyn, Esquire, attorney for the estate of Joseph Campan, Esquire, deceased, filed a bill of errors to the Supreme Court in this matter. Subsequently to these filings, the Common Council of said city instructed Thomas H. Hartwell, Esquire, City Attorney, by resolution, to move said Court for an order to revoke and set aside all the foregoing proceedings in this matter; and upon said motion having been made, thereupon the said Court ordered and adjudged that the report and awards of said jury in said matter, and of the order of said Court he etofore confirming said report and awards made by said jury in this matter, be and the same are hereby revoked and set aside, and all proceedings discontinued in this matter.

In the matter to open and extend Bellair street, in the Sixth Ward of said city. The report and awards of the jury in this matter have been filed, and the same is continued over till the January term of this Court, A. D. 1866. Objections have been filed against the confirmation of this matter.

In the matter to open and extend Russell street, in the Sixth Ward of said city, the jury have filed their report. Objections to the confirmation of the same have been filed. On motion, all further proceedings in this matter have been continued until the January term, A. D. 1866.
