

WOODBRIDGE STREET.

Resolution for opening and extending Woodbridge street across the Mullett Farm:

Be it resolved by the Common Council of the city of Detroit, State of Michigan, that it is necessary to make the following public improvement in said city, to wit: To open and extend Woodbridge street from the westerly to the easterly line of the Mullett Farm, so-called, in the Seventh Ward.

And the said Common Council do hereby declare, that they intend to take and use, for the purpose of making said improvement, all that part of the Mullett Farm bounded and described as follows: Commencing at the intersection of the northerly line of Woodbridge street with the westerly line of the Mullett Farm, and running thence on a course north sixty degrees east to the easterly line of said farm; thence on a course south twenty-six degrees, east fifty feet and twelve hundredths of a foot; thence on a course south sixty degrees west to the westerly line of said farm; thence on a course north twenty-six degrees west fifty feet and twelve hundredths of a foot to the place of beginning.

And the said Common Council do further declare that they will, on the first Monday in the month of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, at the hour of nine o'clock in the forenoon of that day, apply to the Recorder's Court, at the court-room of said court, in said city, for the drawing and empanelling of a jury to ascertain the necessity for using the property above described as intended to be taken and used for the purpose of making said improvement, and to ascertain the just damages and compensation to which any person may be entitled if said improvement be made.

And the City Clerk of said city is hereby directed to cause this resolution to be published for four (4) successive weeks before the said first Monday in February, A. D. 1866, in *The Detroit Daily Free Press*, the official daily newspaper of said city, and the *Detroit Daily Advertiser and Tribune*, another daily newspaper published in said city. And the Superintendent of Police of said city is hereby directed, by himself or by one of the captains or sergeants of police under his direction, to serve notices of this resolution on the persons, and in the manner prescribed in section three of chapter seven of the charter of said city.

CHENE STREET.

Resolution for opening and extending Chene street, from Jefferson avenue to Atwater street:

Be it resolved by the Common Council of the City of Detroit, State of Michigan, that it is necessary to make the following public improvement in said city, to wit: To open and extend Chene street, in the Tenth Ward of said city, from Jefferson avenue to Atwater street.

And the said Common Council do hereby declare that they intend to take and use, for the purpose of making said improvement, all of the westerly twenty-five feet of the Chene Farm, private claim number seven hundred and thirty three, southerly of Jefferson avenue, northerly of Atwater street, and all of the easterly twenty-five feet of the James Campan farm, (east half of private claim number ninety-one), southerly of Jefferson avenue and northerly of Atwater street.

And the said Common Council do further declare that they will, on the first Monday in the month of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, at the hour of nine o'clock in the forenoon of that day, apply to the Recorder's Court, at the court room of said court, in
