

Be it resolved by the Common Council of the city of Detroit, State of Michigan, that it is necessary to make the following public improvement in said city, to-wit: To open and extend Locust street, 50 feet in width, from Fourth street to the Grand River road in the Fifth Ward of said city.

And the said Common Council do hereby declare that they intend to take and use for the purpose of making said improvement the following property, viz: All that part of lots 9, 10, 11, 12, 13 and 14, block 67 of the sub. of the Jones farm south of the Grand River road, embraced within the northerly and southerly lines of Locust street, if the same be extended across said lots on a course N 67° 13' E, 51 feet wide from the easterly line of Fourth street to the westerly line of Grand River road, the southerly line of said Locust street being 248 feet northerly of Oak street.

EIGHTH STREET.

Resolution for opening and extending Eighth street from the northerly line of Michigan avenue to the southerly line of Locust street, in the Ninth Ward.

Be it resolved by the Common Council of the City of Detroit, State of Michigan, that it is necessary to make the following public improvement in said city, to-wit: To open and extend Eighth street from the northerly line of Michigan avenue to the southerly line of Locust street, in the Ninth Ward of said city.

And the said Common Council do hereby declare that they intend to take and use, for the purpose of making said improvement, the following property, viz.: All that part of lots 87, 88 and 89 of the sub. of the Woodbridge farm, and lots 3, 15, 20 and 32 of the sub. of out lot 90 of the sub. of Woodbridge farm, embraced within the easterly and westerly lines of Eighth street, if the same be extended on a course north 22° 47' west, 60 feet wide from the northerly line of Michigan avenue to the southerly line of Locust street; the westerly line of said Eighth street being 293 feet on a course north 61° 13' east from the easterly line of Trumbull avenue.

ATWATER STREET.

Resolution for opening, widening and extending Atwater street from the east line of St. Aubin street to the west line of Dubois street in the Tenth Ward.

Be it resolved by the Common Council of the City of Detroit, State of Michigan, that it is necessary to make the following public improvement in said city, to-wit: To open, widen and extend Atwater street from the east line of St. Aubin street to the west line of Dubois street, in the Tenth Ward of said city.

And the said Common Council do hereby declare that they intend to take and use for the purpose of said improvement the following property, viz.: All that part of the Touissant Campau lot, St. Aubin farm, bounded as follows: Commencing at the southeasterly corner of lot 1, section 2, of the subdivision of the St. Aubin farm south of Jefferson avenue, and running thence south 26 deg. east 35 feet more or less to the southerly line of said Campau lot.
