Gentlemen—For ornamenting the grounds around the new City Hall building, proposals were this day received as follows: According to the plan No. 1, which provides for covering the main front with flagging.

Messrs. Moody & Appleyard propose to furnish all materials and do the work complete according to plans and specifications on file in this office with either Sandusky or Joliet cut stone for the sum of \$21,328.

Messrs. Batchelder & Moreton propose to do the same with Joliet cut stone for \$24,045, or with Sandusky cut stone for \$ 2645, according to plan No. 2, which provides for stone walks, etc., with spaces for grass or other ornamentation between.

Messrs. Moody & Appleyard propose to furnish all materials and do the same work complete according to plans and specifications using either Sandusky or Joliet cut stone for the sum of \$17,987.

Messrs. Batchelder & Moreton propose to do the same, using Joliet cut stone for \$18,244, or with Sandusky cut stone for \$16,892.

Should your honorable body select plan No. 1, the proposal of Moody & Appleyard is the lowest using either kind of stone.

Should plan No. 2, be selected, the proposal of Moody & Appleyard is the lowest if Joliet cut stone is used.

If Sandusky stone is used, the proposal of Batchelder & Moreton is the lowest.

These bidders filed satisfactory bonds in the office before their proposals were opened.

Be it resolved by the Common Council of the city of Detroit, That we, the said Common Council, deem it a necessary public improvement in said city to open and extend Bagg street, from its present termination on the west line of Jones' farm so-called, to Grand River avenue, which said improvement is described by metes and bounds, courses and distances, as follows, to-wit:

All that part of the Forsyth and Labrosse farms bounded as follows: Commencing at the northeasterly corner of lot 10, block 21, Crane and Wesson's section, of part of the Forsyth farm, north of the Grand River avenue, and running thence north 22 degs 47 min., west 60 feet, thence south 67 degs. 13 min., west 480 feet more or less to the easterly line of lot 4 Dickinson's subdivision of part of the Labrosse farm; thence south 28 degs. 32 min., west 5 feet more or less to the northerly line of Grand River avenue; thence south 61 degs. 28 min., east 73 61-100 feet; thence north 67 degs. 13 min., east along the southerly line of Arch street 436 feet more or less to the place of beginning.
