FROM THE INSPECTOR OF GAS METERS.

To the Honorable the Common Council:

Gentlemen—The street lamps have been increased forty-one (41) in number during the quarter ending September 30th, which makes a total at that date of eleven hundred and twenty-five (1125). There have been several breakages of lamps on fountains through carelessness, which I have had made good without expense to the city, and others will be paid for as soon as the amount of damages can be ascertained.

The amount of gas consumed in the street lamps during the quarter was three million two hundred and seven thousand eight hundred and three cubic feet (3,207,803), at a cost of two dollars (\$2) per thousand, with United States tax for July, (there
