construct and operate its railway It is hereby ordained by the Common Council of the City of Detroit:

SECTION 1. An ordinance authorizing the "St. Anbin Avelue Street Railway (o." a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Michigan in regard to tram sailway companies, to construct and operate its railway from Gratiot street to the northerly limits of the city, on St. Aubin avenue. northerly limits of the city, on St. Audin avenue. A diagram of the route of sand railway, within two mouths of the passage hereof, shall be filed with the City Clerk and Surveyor. Provided, That should any part of the territory north of the city limits and through which the track of said road shall be laid, be added to the corporation, then the rights hereby granted shall include and cover so much of the said track as shall be in such territory, and be subject to all the provisos and conditions of this ordinance. tory, and be subject to a conditions of this ordinance.

SEC. 2. Said company is authorized to lay, use

and maintain a single track, with necessary and convenient turn-outs, s de tracks and switches in convenient turn-outs, s are thacks and switches in and along the course of said avenue mentioned in the preceding section, and to operate thereon street railway cars during the term hereinafter preecribed, subject to all the concitions and restrictions of this ordinance.

Such track shall be laid with the inside of each rail two feet four and one-fourth inches from the center of the street. Said ran shall be of the same style and shape as those now in use by the city street railways, and shall be laid four feet eight and street lallways, and shall one-half inches apart, with the upper surface of the rail flush with the surface of the street, and in such a manner as not to interfere with ordinary travel, and particularly of wheeled vehicles, and shall conform to the grade of the streets as existing or

rails, the same shall be done at the expense of the grantee, and in all streets or parts of streets which are not recommended. SEC. 3. If it shall become necessary to relay said or parts of streets which are not paved, the rails shall be laid in such manner as shall least the rails shall be faith the public travel thereon, and as shall be authorized and approved by the Common Council. The grantee and its assigns shall keep the surface of the streets, from curb to curb, in good order and repair, and all snow, ice, durt and good order and repair, and all snow, ice, dirt and filth cleaned a dremoved from such portion of the streets at the expense of the grantee, in such manner as not to obstruct travel in any part of the street. SEC. 4. Said railway shall be laid down subject to the right of the city, or of any gas company, or the Water or Sewer Commissioners, to lay down, take up, change of remove any works of any sind on or beneath the surface of the streets without any claim for damages on the part of said railway.

Sec. 5. The cars to be used on said railway shall be run and drawn by inimals only, at a speed not exceeding six miles an hour, and as often as the Common council shall by resolution prescribe. Provided. The cars and carriages used by said grantee shall be of the best style in use on street railways in the city of Detroit, and they shall not be used for any other purpose than to transport passengers and their ordinary baggage. Provided, That other cars may be used for cleaning said railway track from obstructions by snow or otherwise.

SEC. 6 The trains on said railway shall at all times be entitled to the track, and vehicles on the track shall turn out when any car comes up, so as to leave the track unobstructed, and the driver of any vehicle refusing so to do shall be liable to a fine as provided in section 16 of this ordinan e.

SEC 7. Cars drawn in the same direction shall not approach each other within a distance of 100 leet, except in cases of accident, or at stations, or for the purpose of connecting cars together. All cars used upon said rallroad after sunset shall be provided with signal lights, red in front and green

SEC. 8 No car, or the horses thereto attached, shall be allowed to stop on a crosswalk or in nont of any intersecting street, except to avoid collisions and to prevent danger to persons or prope ty in the street; and drivers shall not allow any person to enter or leave the cars while in motion. Nor shall any car be allowed to remain or stop at the interrection of any street so as to obstruct the free and ordinary use of it. When any car is required to be stopped at the intersection of any street to receive or leave passengers it shall be so stopped as to leave the rear platform slightly over the crossing. Sec. 9. The grantee and its assigns shall employ careinl solver and products assigns and drivers to

SEC. 9. The grante, and its assigns shall employ careful, sober and prudent agents and drivers to take charge of the cars while on the road, and it shall be the duty of all such agents and drivers to keep virilant watch for all trains, carriages and persons on foot, especially children, either upon the track of moving toward it. At the first appearance of danger to such teams, carriages, footmen, children or other obstructions, the cars shall be stopped in the shortest time and space possible,
