DETROIT, Tuesday, September 23, 1873.

The Council was called to order by the President, the Hon. Wm. H. Langley.

Present: Ald. Botsford, Broeg, Christian, Daly, Dullea, Flower, Garrison, Grelling, Hinchman, Hough, Lichtenberg, O'Keefe, Parsons, Preston, Ruehle, Shanahan, Stange, Welch, Woolley, and the President.

The journal of the last session was approved.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS.

On motion of Ald. Woolley the resolution presented on the 16th inst., directing the Controller to advertise five days for repaving Woodward avenue with wood, from Charlotte to Brady street, was taken from the table.

The resolution was adopted by the following vote:
