Gentlemen—Your Committee on Street Openings, to whom was referred the matter of the verdict of a jury in the Recorder's court, in the matter of opening of an alley between Field avenue and Boulevard from Champlain street to Congress street, respectfully report that they have examined the same, and are of the opinion that the property in that locality is largely benefitted by the improvement and should bear the expense of making the same. The award of the jury is five hundred and eighty dollars, and your committee recommend that five hundred and eighty (\$580) dollars of that amount be assessed upon a local district, in accordance with the resolution herewith submitted.

Resolved, That the Common Council of the city of Detroit do hereby fix and determine that the following district and portion of said city of Detroit, to-wit:

Lots 29 to 54, both inclusive, M. W. Field's second subdivision of part of private claim 678 is benefited by the opening of an alley between Field avenue and Boulevard, from Champlain street to Congress street.

And further Resolved, That there be assessed and levied upon the several pieces and parcels of real estate included in the above description, the amount of five hundred and eighty (\$580) dollars in proportion, as near as may be, to the advantage which such lot or parcel is deemed to acquire by such improvement.

And further Resolved, That the Board of Assessors of said City of Detroit be and they are hereby directed to proceed forthwith to make an assessment roll, in conformity with the requirements of the Charter of the City of Detroit, relating to special assessments for collecting the expense of public improvements, comprising the property hereinbefore described, upon which they shall assess and levy the amount of five hundred and eighty dollars, each lot or parcel to be assessed a ratable proportion, as near as may be, of said amount in accordance to the amount of benefit derived by such improvement.

Monroe, for the acceptance of a deed to the city of Detroit of the easterly ten (10) feet of outlots forty-four (44) and forty-five (45), Johnston's subdivision of private claims 727 and 729, as recorded in liber one (1) of plats, page 139, in the office of the Register of Deeds for Wayne County; the easterly ten (10) feet of lot two (2) of Ferdinand Morell's subdivision of out lot five (5), private claim 729, north of Michigan avenue; the easterly ten (10) feet of the north forty (40) feet in width, of the south one hundred and thirty-two (132) feet in width, of lot forty-four (44) of Johnston's subdivision of private claims 727 and 729, being the central part of private claim 727 and 729, north of the Chicago road.
