Resolved, That the deeds executed by Elizabeth C. Brush, Alfred E. Brush and William G. Thompson, conveying to the City of Detroit, for public use as public streets, strips of land lying in said City of Detroit, described as follows: Commencing at the point where the east line of Brush street if extended, would intersect the north line of Alexandrine avenue as opened across the L. Beaubien farm, said point lying 90 feet more or less distant from east line of Brush farm, and running thence north 26 deg., west and parallel with the east line of the Brush farm 5,910 feet more or less to the south line of Harper avenue; thence south 64 deg., west 60 feet; thence south 26 deg., east parallel with the east line of the Brush farm 5,910 feet to the north line of Alexandrine avenue; thence north 64 deg., east 60 feet to place of beginning, said strip of land is deemed for the purpose of a public street known as Brush street.

Also the following:

Commencing at a point where the south line of Alexandrine avenue intersects the west line of the Brush farm and running thence north 60 deg., east 280 feet more or less to the west line of Brush street; thence south 26 deg., east along the west line of Brush street 42 feet, thence north 64 deg., east 150 feet more or less to the east line of the Brush farm, thence north 26 deg., west, 50 feet; thence south 64 deg., west, 150 feet more or less to the west line of Brush street; thence north 26 deg., west, 92.24 feet to the north line of Alexandrine avenue; thence south 60 deg., west, 280 feet more or less to the west line of the Brush farm; thence south 26 deg., east 100.24 feet to place of beginning; said strip of land is deemed for the purpose of a public street known as Alexandrine avenue, be and the same is hereby accepted; and further resolved that the City Controller be and he is hereby directed to have the same recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds of Wayne County.
