## From the Board of Building Inspectors.

To the Honorable the Common Council:

Gentlemen—The undersigned, to whom was referred the resolution offered by Ald. Scovel and adopted by your honorable body March 15, 1898, report as follows: We find at No. 219 Porter street one two-story frame building, 18 feet front and 24 feet deep, with a one-story addition on rear, 22 feet by 13 feet, and a shed on rear of addition, 18 feet by 9 feet; also a two-story frame barn, 16 feet by 16 feet, with a one-story addition on the north, 12 feet by 12 feet; and claimed to be owned by Mrs. Mary Cole. These buildings are old and dilapidated, broken and rotten, in our opinion past repair and should be taken down. Notices Nos. 5149 and 5236 were sent in 1897 and 1898 to make safe these buildings, and no attention has been paid to them. We therefore pray that your honorable body will take such action as will be necessary to compel the owner to make safe these buildings.
