To the Honorable the Common Council:

Gentlemen—Your Committee on Ways and Means, to whom was referred the communication from the Department of Public Works, requesting an appropriation of \$500 for the purchase of two wagons for use by the City Engineer's Department, respectfully report that we have had the same under consideration and beg leave to state that we are satisfied from the explanation made by the City Engineer that the wagons now in use are in such a dilapidated condition

as to render them unfit for further use by the department; that said wagons have been in commission for about fifteen years, and that it would be a waste of money to undertake any repairs on them. The Engineer informs your Committee that he must have two wagons ready for the spring work, but your Committee recommend that but one wagon be allowed at the present time and that action upon making an appropriation for the other wagon be deferred until a decision is made by the Common Council and Board of Estimates on the purchase of a box automobile for the Department, which is included in the estimates, and we therefore recommend the adoption of the following resolution.
