From Sinking Fund Commission.

To the Honorable the Common Council:
Gentlemen—A meeting of the Detroit City Sinking Fund Commission was held at the Wayne County Savings Bank, 11:30 a. m., Tuesday, Sept. 12, 1911, the following members being present: Messrs. Thompson, Walsh, Garvey, Schultz, Deputy City Controller Palmer, acting for Commissioner Heineinan, and Deputy City Treasurer Baumann, acting for Commissioner Koch.

The City Treasurer delivered to the Commissioners forty (40) Special Assessment Bonds, Nos. 4751 to 4790, amounting to \$42,532.92. The Commissioners verified the bonds by numbers and amount and having found same correct, accepted and placed them in the strong box.

The Commissioners took from the strong box and received payment for twenty-five (25) special assessment bonds amounting to \$52,266.36 and of the following numbers: 2628, 2632, 2636, 2640, 2644, 2648, 3199, 3203, 3207, 3211, 3215, 3598, 3602, 3206, 3510, 3614, 4070, 4074, 4078, 4082, 4086, 4090, 4094, 4098 and 4102.

Forty-eight coupons amounting to \$600 were cut from Village of Delray Public Sewer Bonds, Nos. 19 to 28, 30 to 54, 75 to 85, 121 and 122.

The annual interest to Sept. 1, 1911, on special assessment bonds held by the Sinking Fund Commission amounting to \$4,945.67, was paid.
