### FROM THE SAME.

To the Honorable the Common Council:  
Gentlemen — Your Committee on Street Openings, to whom was referred the petition of Samuel Balter asking leave to pay certain unpaid taxes and assessments without penalty and interest, respectfully report we have had the same under consideration and find that petitioner is the owner of the "North 53.70 feet of S. 649 feet and N. 50 feet of S. 699 feet of O. L. 189, L. Beaubien Farm," e. s. Beaubien street; that there remains unpaid against said property general city taxes and special assessments which petitioner asks leave to settle without interest or penalty, but to this your committee cannot agree, as it would be establishing a precedent contrary to the basis of settlement established in claims of this kind for many years past, but in order to compromise the matter, we recommend that petitioner be allowed to pay all unpaid general city taxes and special assessments at the amount of city bid with interest added thereto at the rate of 5 per cent per annum, in full settlement of same, and we therefore offer the following resolution.
