To the Honorable the Common Council:

Gentlemen—Your attention is respectfully directed to a communication from the Board of Health under date of November 12 last and to be found at page 1609 of the Journal of the Common Council for 1912, which sets forth at length the situation as to diphtheria and the necessity for taking extraordinary steps in the matter of combating the epidemic of diphtheria then prevailing, and in that connection requesting your honorable body to furnish the funds to meet the necessary expenditures for that purpose. Your honorable body, pursuant to this request, granted \$1,000.00, which has been fully expended, and it is believed that it will require at least \$2,000 with which to pay obligations already incurred in this connection and other expenses hereafter likely to be required. Your honorable body is

therefore respectfully requested to provide the amount suggested for the purpose described out of such funds as may be available.
