To the Honorable the Common Council: Gentlemen—Your Committee on Streets to whom was referred the communication from the Department of Public Works, transmitting proposals for paving various streets and alleys, respectfully report we have had the same under consideration and find that T. E. Currie is the lowest bidder for paving Helen avenue at \$2.64 and Alley No. 352 at \$1.64; that Detroit Asphalt Paving Co., is lowest bidder for paving Canton avenue with asphaltic concrete, using natural asphalt, at \$2.40; that the Otis Cement Construction Co. is the lowest bidder for paving Alley No. 348 at \$2.99, Alley No. 353 at \$1.85, and Alley No. 354 at \$1.80; that E. Meredith & Co., are lowest bidders for paving alley No. 349 at \$1.53, and alley No. 350 at \$1.60 and that Talbot & Sheperd are lowest bidders for paving alley No. 351 at \$2.05. Your committee being satisfied that the bids submitted are reasonable, recommend that the contracts entered into by the Department of Public Works with the aforesaid lowest bidders for paving above streets and alleys be confirmed, and that the several resolutions, presented by Ald. Keating at a session held on the 23rd inst. (J. C.
