Public Utilities

To the Honorable the Common Council:
Gentlemen—Your Committee on Public Utilities has had under considera- tion for some time a plan for the con- struction of a line of street railway to be operated in connection with the Junction avenue line so as to accom- modate the Milwaukee factory district, so-called, on the east side.

The construction of such a line of railway will of course alter the route determined upon by your Honorable Body on September 30, 1913 (Journal, Common Council, 1913, p. 1384). But your Committee believes that by this alteration a great many more people will be served and accommodated.

Street Railway Commissioner Dodge has taken the plan your Committee has had under consideration up with the Detroit United Railway. Mr. Brooks has consented to the route as determined upon by your Committee upon conditions which are set forth in a communication from Mr. Brooks to Commissioner Dodge, under date of March 29th last. This communication is as follows:

"Am sorry I was unable to get in touch with you yesterday. My Board will agree to the route according to the map which you let me take, upon condition that they are not held to the building of the lines heretofore men- tioned except as to Kercheval avenue which they may want to build only as far as St. Jean and Jefferson, and upon the further condition that the resolution is so drawn as not to hold them to forfeiture in case financial matters should necessitate some delay. As I see it now they will be able to start the work at once and expect to push it to completion without its in-
