By Ald. Glinnan:

Whereas, There is considerable agi-
tation for a change from the Eastern
Standard back to the Central Stand-
ard time, and

Whereas, It is desirable to obtain
an expression of the public will in
this matter; therefore,

Be it Resolved, That a referendum
be held upon the question of retain-
ing Eastern Standard time or chang-
ing back to Central Standard time,
and that said referendum be taken at
a special election, Aug. 29, 1916.

Ald. Glinnan moved the adoption of
the resolution.

Ald. Burton moved its reference to
the Committee on Charter and City
Legislation, as an amendment, which
amendment was lost. The resolution
