

9 state the name or names of persons
10 supplying said meat food products and
11 the localities from which the same is
12 procured.

2 Sec. 3. That no person, partnership
3 or corporation shall sell or deliver or
4 have in his or their possession for
5 sale in the City of Detroit any meat
6 food products which contain any un-
7 healthful ingredients, constituent or
8 substance, which has been transported,
9 handled, or stored in an unclean man-
10 ner, or produced from any animal
11 which is diseased; nor shall any meat
12 food product be sold or delivered in
13 said City which is procured from any
14 farm, slaughter house, commission
15 house, or food products manufactur-
16 ing establishment, where any con-
17 tagious or infectious or communicable
disease exists.

2 Sec. 4. That no person, partnership
3 or corporation shall slaughter or sell
4 meat food products, or have meat food
5 products in his or their possession
6 with intent to sell within the City of
7 Detroit without first obtaining a li-
8 cense from the Mayor of said city
9 for that purpose; said license shall
10 be granted for the period of one year
and renewed annually thereafter.

2 Sec. 5. The sum of five dollars shall
3 be charged for each slaughtering or
4 meat food products establishment and
5 one dollar for each delivery wagon li-
6 cense, and the sum of fifty cents shall
7 be charged for each meat market li-
8 cense so granted, which sum shall be
9 paid before said license be granted.
10 It shall be the duty of the City Treas-
11 urer to turn into the Public Health
12 Fund of said city all moneys so re-
13 ceived for the licensing of persons
14 engaged in conducting a slaughter
15 house or meat food products establish-
16 ment or market, or in the distribution
17 and sale of meat food products, such
18 moneys to be used by said Board in
19 the enforcement and carrying out of
the provisions of this ordinance.

2 Sec. 6. Any person violating any of
3 the provisions of this ordinance shall
4 be punished by a fine of not less than
5 ten dollars nor more than one hun-
6 dred dollars for each offense, and each
7 day upon which any of the provisions
8 hereof are violated shall constitute a
9 distinct and separate offense, and in
10 the imposition of any fine imposed the
11 court may make the further sentence
12 that in default of such fine the offend-
13 er may be imprisoned in the Detroit
14 House of Correction until payment
15 thereof for any period of time not ex-
ceeding six months.

2 Sec. 7. This ordinance shall take im-
mediate effect.

and referred to Committee on Ordi-
nances.

the older and the newer portions of the
nineteenth ward is wholly inadequate,
and there is a lack of equipment and
buildings which seriously endangers the
citizens and particularly the schools in
the vicinity, therefore be it

Resolved, That the Board of Fire Com-
missioners be and is hereby requested to
prepare an estimate to cover the cost of
procuring sites and the erection of a
sufficient number of fire halls to meet
the pressing need of protection.

Clairepointe avenue, between Jefferson
avenue and Essex avenue.

lic Works be and is hereby requested to
transmit to the City Controller, an esti-
mate in an amount sufficient to construct
a suitable bridge across Ashland avenue,
between Jefferson and Freud avenues, and
include same in the forthcoming budget.
