Sec. 4. or corporation shall slaughter or sell meat food products, or have meat food products in his or their possession with intent to sell within the City of Detroit without first obtaining a li-cense from the Mayor of said city for that purpose; said license shall be granted for the period of one year

and renewed annually thereafter.
Sec. 5. The sum of five dollars shall 10 be charged for each slaughtering or meat food products establishment and one dollar for each delivery wagon license, and the sum of fifty cents shall be charged for each meat market license so granted which are shall be be charged for each meat market li-cense so granted, which sum shall be paid before said license be granted. It shall be the duty of the City Treas-urer to turn into the Public Health Fund of said city all moneys so re-ceived for the licensing of persons engaged in conducting a slaughter house or meat food products establish-10 11 12 house or meat food products establishment or market, or in the distribution and sale of meat food products, such moneys to be used by said Board in 13 14 15 17

moneys to be used by said Board in the enforcement and carrying out of the provisions of this ordinance.

Sec. 6. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than one hundred dollars for each offense, and each ten dollars nor more than one hundred dollars for each offense, and each day upon which any of the provisions hereof are violated shall constitute a distinct and separate offense, and in the imposition of any fine imposed the court may make the further sentence that in default of such fine the offender may be imprisoned in the Detroit 10 er may be imprisoned in the Detroit House of Correction until payment thereof for any period of time not ex-13 ceeding six months.
