**From the Board of Assessors.**

To the Honorable the Common Council: Gentlemen—We herewith transmit to your honorable body assessment rolls numbered 2528 to 2535, both inclusive, for grading and paving the following streets and alleys:

Roll No. 2528—Hazelwood avenue, from the west curb line of Schmitt diel avenue to the east curb line of Twelfth street.

Roll No. 2529—Poplar street, from the west line of Maybury Grand avenue to the east curb line of Tillman avenue.

Roll No. 2530—Alley No. 855, being all the alleys in block between Third, Second, Putnam and Merrick avenues.

Roll No. 2531—Alley No. 872, being the east and west alley; also, the north and south alley first west of Cass avenue between Second, Cass, Kirby and Ferry avenues.

Roll No. 2532—Alley No. 890, being the alley first east of and parallel to Second avenue, from Kirby avenue to Ferry avenue.

Roll No. 2533—Alley No. 856, being the alley between Third and Second avenues, Chicago Boulevard and Boston Boulevard.

Roll No. 2534—Alley No. 861, being the alley between John R., Brush, Theodore and Farnsworth streets.

Roll No. 2535—Alley No. 891, being the north and south alley between Humboldt avenue, Eighteenth, Myrtle and Magnolia streets.

The usual notice required by law has been given to the parties in interest, as will appear by the annexed notices and affidavits of publication. No person has appeared to object to said rolls, or to ask any correction thereof. We have, therefore, signed the same, and report them to your Honorable Body.
