To the Honorable the Common Council: Gentlemen—Under date of April 15 your Honorable Body adopted a resolution offered by Councilman Kronk directing the City Controller to place at our disposal the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for improving a proposed playground site on Konkel Avenue between Wesson and Junction Avenues.

This property consists of a field of approximately eleven acres, and for some time has been used as a dump. A portion of it is very low causing the formation of a pond containing considerable water. The balance of the field is high and irregular.

We have commenced work of grading a sufficient area to provide for two baseball diamonds in accordance with the resolution, and we are satisfied that to do even this limited work properly the sum furnished is far insufficient. If the work is done in a good workmanlike manner and backstops are erected, we will in all probability require an additional sum of fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500).

Will your Honorable Body kindly give this consideration so that we may be governed as to the policy in the work now under way.
