**From the City Plan Commission.**

To the Honorable the Common Council: Gentlemen—To facilitate better traffic conditions at the junction of West Park Place, State street and Cass avenue, the City Plan Commission offers the following recommendation, in connection with the widening of Cass avenue.

Owing to the period which has elapsed since this plan was originally presented (November 30, 1918), and the great increase of traffic congestion on all streets within a half mile radius of the City Hall, the Commission recommends that additional property be ordered condemned for the widening of Cass avenue between Grand River avenue and Michigan avenue, namely, the remaining portions of lots 77 and 78 on West Park Place, also lot 79 on State street at the junction of Cass avenue and the west eleven feet (11 feet) of lot 80 facing on State street, since it is the opinion of the Commission that traffic on Cass avenue at the intersection of State street and West Park Place will be greatly facilitated thereby.

**From the City Plan Commission.**

To the Honorable the Common Council: Gentlemen—In compliance with a request from the Board of Water Commissioners, under date of October 14th, asking this Commission to consider the opening of Turner avenue, south of Schoolcraft, after careful study, this Commission recommends the following to your Honorable Body for consideration.

That Turner avenue be opened to a width of sixty feet (60') through its unopened portion, south of Schoolcraft avenue. All of the above as indicated in yellow on attached blueprint, Plan No. 207.

Inasmuch as the Board of Water Commissioners find it necessary at the present time to lay a water main in that street, we therefore recommend that your Honorable Body give this matter your early consideration.
