These accounts are numbered to conform with the new budget for the fiscal year 1920-1921.

The Board of Fire Commissioners respectfully requests your Honorable Body to grant this transfer and also ask that you approve the awarding of the contract to Bryant & Detwiler, in the sum of their bid; viz. \$162,937.00.
