Six hundred

By Councilman Vernor:

Resolved, That the boundaries of the election precincts of the Thirteenth, Fifteenth and Seventeenth Wards, in so far as they pertain to the precincts hereinafter described, be and the same are hereby fixed and defined as follows:

THIRTEENTH WARD

23rd Precinct—Bounded on the north by the M. C. and G. T. railroads; south by East Grand Boulevard and Griffin; east by Mt. Elliott; west by westerly limits of Hamtramck and Jos. Campau.

24th Precinct—Bounded on the north by the northerly city limits; south by the M. C. and G. T. railroads and northerly limits of Hamtramck; east by Mt. Elliott; west by the easterly limits of Hamtramck and Conant avenue.

FIFTEENTH WARD

28th Precinct—Bounded on the north by Huber; south by Miller; east by Centerline; west by Mt. Elliott.

29th Precinct—Bounded on the north by the G. T. railroad; south by Huber; east by Centerline and a line 200 ft. west of Van Dyke and by Van Dyke avenue; west by Mt. Elliott.

30th Precinct—Bounded on the north
