Tapert and Catherine Tapert, his wife, to the City of Detroit, of all that certain piece or parcel of land, situate in the City of Detroit, being all that part of lots 64 and 65 of plat of subdivision of lot 6 of private claim 60 in T. 2 S., R. 11 E. for J. Belknap and A. S. Drake, more particularly described as follows: A stake in the easterly line of Central avenue distant 100 feet from the northerly line of Ferndale avenue; thence easterly along a line parallel with the northerly line of Ferndale avenue and distant 100 feet therefrom, a distance of 189.75 feet to a stake in the westerly line of a public alley run-
