From the Department of Motor Transportation.

To the Honorable the Common Council:

Gentlemen—This Department, on December 1, 1921, took over the direct control of the Motor Vehicles owned by the Department of Public Works, garage equipment, superintendent and their men. This has the approval of the Mayor and Commissioner Martin, of the Department of Public Works.

We have opened a garage at No. 2051 Lafayette boulevard to be used for the storage of the following Departments' cars: Department of Public Works, Board of Health, Buildings and Safety Engineering, Public Welfare, Street Railway, Recreation, Purchases and Supplies, Civil Service, House of Correction and City Treasurer.

The Sixth and Abbott garage will be used entirely as a repair shop and supply station for the above mentioned Departments. This Department also desires to consolidate the Garage Fund with the Motor Transportation Fund, and hopes a satisfactory arrangement can be made with the Controller.
