Gentlemen-We have had numerous requests for copies of the zoning ordinance and maps and in such large numbers from such organizations as the Detroit Real Estate Board, Michigan Manufacturers' Association and Milwaukee Junction Manufacturers' Association, as well as many others, that it appears at the present time that the five thousand copies which your Honorable Body authorized printed will be required to take care of these organizations alone.
