

some time before the new power plant to be built by this department will be in operation, it is necessary to provide for the supply of electrical power for the several city departments, in excess of that which may be furnished from the public lighting plant, by entering into a contract with the Detroit Edison Company, for furnishing the City of Detroit, in its several departments, including the Department of Street Railways, the required power.

After a careful consideration of the requirements of the several departments and of the terms under which the Detroit Edison Company will furnish the power required, a contract was drawn up and a copy thereof submitted to the Fire Commission, the Board of Water Commissioners and the Street Railway Commission for consideration, criticism and approval if acceptable. Such approval has been secured from the above mentioned departments.

Whereas the terms under which the excess power required by this department are also satisfactory to the Board of Public Lighting Commissioners, permission is asked to have this department enter into a contract for the City of Detroit, with the Detroit Edison Company, for the required power supply.
