Gentlemen: Acting upon a resolution from your Honorable Body directing the City Plan Commission to make a survey as to the advisability of opening Shoemaker through to Gratiot avenue, and submit our findings to your Honorable Body, a plan was prepared which we are submitting for your consideration. It is our opinion that the plan attached hereto, No. 354-1 is the most practicable one which can be made, several others having been studied previously.

We, therefore, recommend the above described plan for the opening of Shoemaker to a width of eighty-six feet (86 feet) from its existing terminus at McClellan avenue to the intersection of Belvidere and Gratiot avenues.

All of the above as outlined in yellow, on attached blueprint, Plan No. 354-1.
