To the Honorable the Common Council:

Gentlemen—During the past year the duties of our "Grade II" Stenographer have been greatly increased. The incumbent is at present doing the work of a secretarial stenographer, a higher grade than that in which he is classified, and is receiving considerably less salary than most other men in similar positions.

We would respectfully request that his salary be increased from \$1,800.00 to \$2,160.00, effective January 1st, the necessary additional amount for the remainder of the fiscal year (\$180.00) being available in our salary account.
