space between the fireproof ceiling and the roof or balcony above and that this space is not used for any purpose whatsoever, except to carry piping and vent flues of not less than 14 gauge galvanized iron. Such pipes and flues upon entering and leaving said open space shall have a two (2) inch flange turned outside the fireproofing.

All other trusses shall be fireproofed as required for all other structural steel members.

The exterior walls shall be of masonry at least eight (8) inches thick and all walls when less than three feet from adjacent privately owned property shall be solid and without openings of any kind, except that windows may be placed in such walls when eight (8) feet or more above the highest point of the roof of an adjacent building, but such windows shall be fire windows for the lowest four (4) stories, unless the adjacent building is fireproof, and windows may be placed in such walls when no building is constructed within ten (10) feet of the lot line, but such windows shall be made to comply with the requirements of this section whenever the adjacent building shall be increased in height or whenever a building shall be constructed within ten (10) feet of such windows.
