To the Honorable the Common
Council:

Gentlemen—The American Insti-
tute of Park Executives, which is
composed of Park and Recreation
Executives, will hold it's annual
convention in Washington, D.C.,
October 6th to the 9th.

The Playground and Recreation
Convention, at which delegates
from all over the World will be
present, will be held October 16th
to the 21st.

Your Commissioner of Recreation
is Chairman of the Playground and
Recreation Section of the American
Institute of Park Executives, and
is also scheduled to talk on Neigh-
borhood Organization, at the Recre-
ation Convention, and wishes to at-
tend these Conventions as a dele-
gate of the City of Detroit.

During the time between the two
Conventions, your Commissioner de-
sires to investigate other municipal
recreation systems, and particular-
ly municipal camps.

I therefore respectfully request
