

Pension Committee took favorable action on the pension petition of Mrs. Theresa M. Domagalski, 7055 Duncan Avenue, widow of late Assistant Engineer Frank M. Domagalski, who died from gangrene resulting from exposure while in the performance of duty at the Michigan Yacht and Power Company's fire on February 14th, 1905, the pensions to be paid at the rate of \$50.00 per month, for herself and \$10.00 per month for her five year old son, Raymond, from and after January 26, 1924, the date of Frank M. Domagalski, death.

The Committee also acted favorably in the case of the posthumous child of Mrs. Anna Murphy, who, with her other four children, was granted pension on December 10th, 1923. The posthumous child, Joseph Durack, to receive pension at the rate of \$10.00 per month from and after February 19th, 1924, the date of its birth.

To provide for the payment of these pensions for the current fiscal year, your Honorable Body is hereby requested to direct that the sum of \$353.00 be appropriated from such fund as may be available, this amount to be credited to the Fire Department Pension Fund for the purpose stated.
