To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—The Department is in receipt of a request for grading Dickerson avenue from Harper to Warren avenues. A portion of the street now dedicated is such that if the street is graded there will be only room for one vehicle on the graded portion.

Dickerson avenue is projected at a 120-foot street between the points mentioned. To accomplish this widening it is proposed to take sufficient property from the City Park property.

If the Common Council is of the opinion that this street should be graded, as requested, the necessary property should be provided to make Dickerson avenue the width proposed.

The accompanying drawing indicates the situation as above outlined.

To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—The setting back of the curbs on Columbia street be-

tween Brush and Beaubien streets brings the existing sidewalk in such proximity to the curb, due to the relocation of the sidewalk grade to the curb grade, as to create an unsafe and unsightly condition.

The lowering of the sidewalk on the south side is a very simple matter, since there are no building or residence entrances involved.

On the north side there are two buildings located immediately adjacent to Brush street where steps will have to be added and the coping of a stairway entrance will have to be changed, if the sidewalk is lowered. If the walk is lowered the line of the walk should be changed so as to move it nearer to the curb.

I respectfully recommend that the department be authorized and directed to reconstruct the walks in this block to grade and make such adjustments in steps at building entrances as may be necessary, the cost of the work to be charged against the \$125,000 allowed for street improvements in the Traffic Loop.
