Gentlemen-The setting back the curbs on Columbia street be-

tween Brush and Beaublen streets brings the existing sidewalk in such proximity to the curb, due to the relation of the sidewalk grade to the curb grade, as to create an unsafe and unsightly condition.

The lowering of the sidewalk on the south side is a very simple matter, since there are no building or residence entrances involved.

On the north side there are two buildings located immediately adjacent to Brush street where steps will have to be added and the coping of a stairway entrance will have to be changed, if the sidewalk is lowered. If the walk is lowered the line of the walk should be changed so as to move it nearer

I respectfully recommand that the department be authorized and directed to reconstruct the walks in this block to grade and make such adjustments in steps at building entrances as may be necessary, the cost of the work to be charged against the \$125,000 allowed for street improvements in the Traffic
