nue from the Highland Park line The question Twelfth street. arises as to what width this pavement should be made. If the pavement is continued easterly in conformity with curb line west Twelfth Street, the width would be 85 feet, including the track space. The estimated cost per foot to abutting property would be \$15.00, or \$450 for each 30 feet.

If the street were paved 54 feet wide, the estimated cost per foot would be \$8.75, or \$262.50 for each

30 feet.
