To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—I beg to advise your Honorable Body that on the 31st day of August, 1925, there was filed in my office by James V. Oxtoby, Dime Savings Bank Building, Detroit, an initiatory petition in the form of a proposed ordinance to widen Woodward Avenue from Adams Avenue to Watson Street to a width of 120 feet. The petitioners pray for the adoption of this ordinance by your Honorable Body, and that if it be no so adopted, that it be submitted to a vote of the electors.

I have carefully investigated the aforesaid petitions and hereby certify that the number of bona fide signatures appearing thereon, after deducting those found to be irregular, exceeds five per centum of the total number of votes cast for all candidates for the office of Mayor at the last general municipal election, and in accordance with Section 6, Chapter II, Title III, of the Detroit City Charter, I am transmitting the proposed ordinance herewith for your consideration.
