Gentlemen—At a meeting of your Honorable Body held on March 9, 1926, your Honorable Body granted

this Department permission to employ two additional Junior Chemists at a salary of \$1,920 each per year, in order that the Department might keep a continuous check of the condition of the water twenty-four hours a day.

It now appears that it will be necessary for this Department to have a specific appropriation for these two positions as neither of these positions has been included in the schedule of positions published in the appropriation book for the fiscal year 1926-7.

The Department therefore respectfully petitions your Honorable Body for permission to employ two Junior Chemists at \$1,920 each per year for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1927.

Likewise, this Department has an appropriation for one Junior Draftsman at \$2,500 per year. The Department respectfully petitions your Honorable Body to change the title of this position from Junior Draftsman to Senior Draftsman at \$2,500 per year.
