Dear Sir—We are building a concrete pavement through the River Rouge Park, running from Warren Avenue to Plymouth Road, and respectfully request that a resolution be passed at the next meeting of the Common Council giving us consent to take over this roadway for construction.

We also respectfully request that a resolution be passed giving us consent to take over a section of Lahser Road, extending southerly from Grand River Avenue to the Five Mile Road.

Lahser Road, extending southerly from Grand River avenue to Five Mile Road.

Provided, however, the said City of Detroit hereby reserves to itself the control, occupation and use of the said streets within the limits of the City for public travel thereon, and uses thereof as the said City now has or may hereafter have necessity to use the same, and for the legitimate purposes and uses granted or hereafter to be granted by said City to any public utility and as fully in those regards as though this resolution had not been adopted.

E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 4, T. 2, S. R. 11 E., as recorded in Liber 28, page 19 of Plats of Wayne County Records described as follows: Beginning at a point on the northerly line of said lot 14, being also the southerly line of Roy avenue as platted in George J. Sass Subdivision of North 149.5 ft. of lot 15 and lot 16 to 23 both inclusive, also lots 1, 2, 3, 40, 39 and south 149.5 ft. of lot 38 of Fox and Quinns Subdivision of west 49 acres of S.
