Gentlemen—In answer to your communication instructing the Corporation Counsel to negotiate a cash settlement or purchase of the property involved in the widening of Larkins Avenue at the corner of Michigan, we would respectfully inform your Honorable Body that we have had the matter under consideration with Mr. Frank Ellias who is the owner of the property and have agreed upon stated damages in the amount of \$28,000.00 which divides into the following items: \$15,000 for the property, \$11,000 for the make-over and remodelling of the building and \$2,000 for the liquidation of the lease which is terminated by this action.

Under this agreement the part of the building which is over the line on Michigan Avenue will be rebuilt

on the proper line without compensation.
