

operate with the Public Lighting Commission to reduce the number of poles necessary on said thoroughfares. Upon completion of said installation the City shall furnish the current required for the operation of the lamps; will replace incandescent lamps; will clean the glassware on the lighting standards when necessary and will maintain the entire lighting system in proper manner

Provided, further, that the expense of the lighting equipment and its installation fronting on public property shall be borne by the City.

Provided, This arrangement shall be subject to any charter amendment, or, to the terms of any general ordinance which may hereafter be adopted by the city and shall also be subject to any reasonable readjustments or modifications that changed conditions such as traffic, street lighting or costs of production may render necessary or advisable but this arrangement shall terminate in any event upon the expiration of the life of the equipment installed hereunder.

Provided, further, the Public Lighting Commission is hereby authorized to make a similar arrangement with property owners in connection with any change in lighting equipment and installation on Bagley Avenue or Broadway, or any other street that may request the same.
