To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—The Village of Birmingham is cognizant of the difficulties encountered by the City of Detroit in establishing its control over public transportation in its streets, and does not wish to be thought otherwise than sympathetic with Detroit's purposes.

It is, however, with regret that the Village of Birmingham learns of the discontinuance of the service of the Suburban Rapid Transit Co. between these two municipalities, in obedience to your Ordinances governing motor vehicle transportation.

It is our understanding that ve-
