Gentlemen—By resolution adopted October 4, 1927, your Honorable Body gave the Department of Public Works authority to raze the front threestory brick building at the foot of Leib Street. Remaining portions of the building at this location were to be and are being used by the Municipal Waste Division of the department.

At the writer's request, the Budget Director made a check of certain accounts in the Municipal Waste Division, in order to afford guidance with the 1928-29 respect to items in This check disclosed the fact that the Superintendent of the Municipal Waste Division had spent \$7,150.00 in alterations and repairs to the building above referred to. He charged the same to account 16-B— Street and Alley Cleaning, General Road Fund. The Superintendent did

this without authority from any one. It is now necessary to request your Honorable Body to transfer the sum of \$7,150.00 from account 16-B, to
