H. Maybury Sanatorium will be called upon to provide facilities for the care of the tuberculosis patients in return for reimbursement by the County of Wayne. In anticipation of this reimbursement your Honorable Body, together with the Mayor, will be asked to allow a credit item in the 1928-29 Budget something in excess of \$1,000,000.00.

The new obligation upon the Sanatorium will add greatly to the necessities of that institution. The Department of Health desires to provide immediately for 150 new beds in the Sanatorium proper, a nurses home and additional facilities for the care of children. It is estimated that with money now available an additional appropriation of \$500,000 will be necessary for this purpose.

To make these facilities available at the earliest possible time it will be necessary that the money be provided prior to the opening of the spring construction period. It is, therefore, recommended that your Honorable Body appropriate by emergency resolution the sum of \$500,000.00 with a commitment on the ensuing budget in this amount.

Whereas, an exigency and emergency has been declared to exist involving the peace, health and safety of the City of Detroit, because of the necessity of providing additional facilities at the William H. Maybury Sanatorium, and

Whereas, on account of the foregoing circumstances involving the peace, health and safety of the City of Detroit, it becomes necessary to borrow the sum of \$500,000.00 on the faith and credit of the City to carry out the aforementioned purpose, and be it

Resolved, that the City Controller be and he is hereby authorized and directed to borrow the sum of \$500,000.00 or such parts thereof as needed to defray the expenses of meeting and caring for such exigency and emergency at the lowest possible rate of interest which can be obtained by him in the open market, and therefore be it

Resolved, That the sum of \$500,000.00 be credited to the Board of Health Fund for the above purpose, and be it further

Resolved, That the sum of \$500,000.00 so borrowed by the City Controller shall be repaid from an item appearing in the annual budget of the City of Detroit for the fiscal year commencing July 1st, 1928, and ending June 30th, 1929.

Department of Public Works

To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—By resolution adopted October 4, 1927, your Honorable Body gave the Department of Public Works authority to raze the front three-story brick building at the foot of Leib Street. Remaining portions of the building at this location were to be and are being used by the Municipal Waste Division of the department.

At the writer's request, the Budget Director made a check of certain accounts in the Municipal Waste Division, in order to afford guidance with respect to items in the 1928-29 budget. This check disclosed the fact that the Superintendent of the Municipal Waste Division had spent \$7,150.00 in alterations and repairs to the building above referred to. He charged the same to account 16-B—Street and Alley Cleaning, General Road Fund. The Superintendent did this without authority from any one.
