To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—In our communication of July 30th (J. C. C. 1784), we informed your Honorable Body that Mr. Edward Callaghan requested that a reduction be made on his 1931-1932 general tax on the land being dedicated for Lyndon and Ilene Aves.

The land dedicated for Lyndon Avenue is 619 feet long and 33 feet wide and for Ilene Avenue is 294 feet long and 30 feet wide, approximately 7-10 of an acre.

Your Honorable Body was of the opinion at the time that this was a reasonable request, so we recommend the adoption of the following resolution.

in full settlement for 1931 City Tax, on the following described property, "Ward 16, Bk. 13, Folio 3664—All that part lying W. of and adjacent Wyoming Ave., S. of and E. of Wark Gilbert's Orchard Grove Subdivision and N. of and adj. Resolved, That quit claim deed of James A. Park and Alice Park (his wife), Archie W. Park (a single man), John R. Park (a single man), Patrick H. Park and Ellen Park (his wife), Thomas C. Park and Morine M. Park (his wife), Jennie Park (a single girl) and Mary Park (Mother) to the City of Detroit covering property dedicated for street purposes, described as "All that part of the S. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 19 T. 1 S. R. 11 E. described as follows: Beginning at the intersection of the easterly line of Greenfield Avenue, 66 feet wide with the East and West $\frac{1}{4}$ line of Section 19, T. 1 S.
