**From the City Treasurer**

To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—Attached is a report showing the amount of 1940 taxes collected during the fiscal year 1940, and the delinquent taxes collected during the fiscal year 1940.

It will be noticed that 95.07 per cent of the net levy for 1940 was collected during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1941.

The 1940 Budget as set up, calls for 100 per cent collection of current taxes, but it was understood that we would borrow the amount which we did not collect. It was estimated that we would collect 93 per cent of the levy, and the figures show that we collected in excess of the estimate.

The delinquent tax credit in the Budget was set at \$8,000,000, but it was estimated that we would collect approximately \$6,500,000, the difference being set up to overcome a part of the deficit. The figures indicate that we collected \$6,296,263.26, which is approximately \$200,000 less than the estimated amount.

The combined total of the current and delinquent tax collections exceeded the estimate made when the Budget was prepared.
