Gentlemen—This department is in receipt of a petition from the Golfhurst Land Company for extension of water main in Rossini Avenue from Cordell Avenue to east of Shakespeare Avenue a distance of 1,851.17 feet; the petitioners have paid the entire

assessment for the frontage passed, in the amount of \$2,128.85.
