To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—This department is in receipt of a petition from Welton Homes Company for extension of water main in Novara Avenue between Crusade and Redmond, requiring the laying of some 1,309 ft. of 8 in. pipe, to serve several lots in the Obenauer-Barber-Laing Ternes Gardens Subdivision and in Assessor's Plat of John Salter Estate Subdivision. The petitioner has paid the entire assessment of \$2,718.23, and authorization has been granted by the War Production Board for this construction.

Your Honorable Body, therefore is respectfully requested to adopt the attached resolution declaring the necessity for the work and authorizing the levy of assessment in accordance with City Ordinance.
