Whereas, The Furniture Club of Detroit, maintaining its Club and headquarters in the Book-Cadillac hotel, in the City of Detroit, Michigan, is a non-profit corporation, incorporated under the laws of the State of Michigan, and

Whereas, The Furniture Club of Detroit is organized to promote, attain and maintain a high standard of ethics in the Furniture Industry; to promote the social welfare of its members; and to do Charitable Acts, and

Whereas, World War One returned to this Nation some four hundred soldiers, sailors and marines totally blinded as a result of wounds, accidents and injuries suffered in the performance of their duty; and, further, that we might reasonably expect an even greater number of blind to result from their participation in World War II owing to the enormously increased military and naval personnel; now, therefore be it

Resolved, That we, the members of The Furniture Club of Detroit, in annual meeting assembled this seventh day of December, nineteen-hundred Forty-three, A. D., do hereby pledge to the Honorable Edward J. Jeffries, Mayor of the City of Detroit, the Honorable Common Council and the Citizens of the City of Detroit, a total of ten (10) dogs trained to lead the blind, commonly known as guide dogs, or such equivalents thereto as may be available at such time as this resolution becomes operative, for any member of the United States Army, Navy or Marine Corps, male or female, and including nurses in the American Red Cross Corps, who shall have, as a result of his or her regular performance of duty, suffered wounds, accidents or injuries rendering said person totally blind; and who shall have been a bona fide resident of the City of Detroit for a period of not less than six months prior to his or her induction into said services; subject to approval by the Club; and be it further

Resolved, That by the adoption of this resolution, neither The Furniture Club of Detroit, or any of its members, individually or collectively, be committed or obligated either by mention or implication to any one or all of the dog training organizations in

existence now or during the life of this resolution; and, be it further

Resolved, That all interested parties take due cognizance of the significant fact that this resolution was presented for adoption on the second anniversary of "Pearl Harbor"; and that it is fitting that a true copy of same be spread on the minutes of The Furniture Club of Detroit.
